INTRODUCTION

Rail transportation is critical to the Chicago region's economy. Congestion in Chicago's rail network negatively affects local and regional community mobility and quality of life, passenger rail performance, and the national supply chain due to our position as the hub of North America's rail system. Rail infrastructure investments can directly improve performance of the national rail system as well as the mobility of passengers and freight within the region, while also addressing negative local impacts that can accompany transportation infrastructure.

In 2003, the Chicago Department of Transportation (CDOT) completed the *Chicago Freight Rail Futures Study*, which provided a comprehensive picture of the economic impacts of the rail industry for the City and region. The study's findings supported the increased investment in rail infrastructure, including the Chicago Region Environmental and Transportation Efficiency (CREATE) Program, a first-of-its kind public-private partnership to modernize the region's freight and passenger rail network.

CDOT has commissioned a new study to examine the current impacts and needs of freight and passenger rail in the region. This study, *Chicago Rail Futures Study II*, will document how the regional rail system has evolved in recent decades, investigate rail benefits and impacts to users and residents including local equity issues, and assess current opportunities for rail-related infrastructure investments in the region including the future of the CREATE Program.




